Stendhal Syndrome, sudden faintness or even collapse in the presence of great beauty, usually of a work of art, architecture, or landscape, or was named after Marie-Henri Beyle (1783–1842), better known by his pen name, Stendhal (*Wikipedia*).

The question that I keep combining across is what happens in contemporary art, where the site of the art moves away from the painting /image into a middle ground that is set up by the subjectivity of the gallery visitor. The work is a placeholder for the visitor to locate themselves.

The art object is the *objet a*, the unattainable object of desire sought in the Other, the gap in the Symbolic, the leftover when the Symbolic enters the Real. Beauty is an idea in the mind projected onto a physical object, a product of the Other, the unconscious. The Stendhal Syndrome is a product of the subject coming face to face with the Real, with its own non-existence, the impossibility of its desire and representation. Read summary statement.
