Don Kunze is a Professor Emeritus of Architecture and Integrative Arts in the Department of Architecture at Penn State University. He has taught at Penn State, the Washington-Alexandria Centre of Architecture (Virginia Tech.), the University at Buffalo, and Louisiana State University. He was trained as an architect but earned advanced degrees in Geography at Georgia State University and Penn State. He is the author of *Thought and Place*, on the theory of imagination of the 18c. cultural theorist, Giambattista Vico. He continues to write on architecture, Lacan, and topology. He is one of the founding members of iPSA, the Institute for Psychoanalytical Studies of Architecture.
